Discuss these safety tips with your Trick-or-Treaters before venturing out on Halloween night:

- To keep homes safe for visiting Trick-or-Treaters, remove from the porch and front yard anything a child could trip over such as garden hoses, toys, bikes and lawn decorations.
- A responsible adult should always accompany young children on their neighborhood rounds.
- If older children are going alone, plan and review the route that is acceptable. Agree on a specific time when they should return home. Make sure someone has a fully charged cell phone in case of an emergency.
- Remain on well-lit streets and always use the sidewalk. If no sidewalk is available, walk at the far edge of the roadway facing traffic.

- Only cross the street as a group in established crosswalks. Never cross between parked cars or out driveways.
- Don't assume the right of way. Motorists may have trouble seeing Trick-or-Treaters. Just because one car stopped doesn't mean other cars will.
- Law enforcement authorities should be notified immediately of any suspicious or unlawful activity.
- Consider the idea of embracing the Halloween spirit with your trick-or-treaters by dressing up or painting your face. Take some fun pictures. Wear your smile, bring a warm beverage and flashlight and enjoy this festive activity.
